

PhD opportunities for Black British graduates at Bayes Business School (formerly Cass)

Applications are invited from exceptional and ambitious Black British graduates wishing to pursue cutting-edge PhD research at Bayes Business School (formerly Cass).

As part of our work in this area, we hope to help address the significant under-representation of Black British students in postgraduate research and throughout academia.

Studentships will be awarded to students based on outstanding academic achievement and research potential in the following subject areas:

- Accounting
- Actuarial Science
- Finance
- Management, Marketing and Operations Management

REF 2014

Our REF 2014 results place us 6th in the UK: this highlights the world class quality of Bayes Business School research and recognises the impact it has on business and policymakers.

STUDENTSHIPS

We offer 1 PhD studentship for Black British graduates comprising tuition fees and a maintenance grant of £16,057 per annum for four years, starting in October 2022. Studentships also offer funding for conference attendance over the four years.

COURSE STRUCTURE

The PhD track lasts 4 years with first year students taking taught modules across a range of topics as well as in research methodology. Years 2 to 4 are devoted to working on the PhD dissertation; further training includes reading groups in specific research areas, workshops on presentation skills and academic writing and intense pre-job market training. Be a UK student, with assessed fee-status equal to 'home'.

Be of Black ethnicity:


- a) Black African
- b) Black Caribbean
- c) Black Other
- d) Mixed – White and Black Caribbean
- e) Mixed – White and Black African
- f) Other mixed background (to include Black African, Black Caribbean or Black Other)

You must hold a first degree (a first or equivalent) in a subject related to your proposed research topic.

The following qualifications are highly desirable and would enhance your likelihood of being accepted:

A master's degree from a leading institution with a distinction or equivalent

A GMAT score (700 or more) if you do not have UK or EU degree.
