Following the financial crisis of 2007-09, the regulatory framework was overhauled to reduce the fragility of the banking sector and adverse effects to other financial institutions and the real economy. Fifteen years later, the banking sector is yet again at the center of turmoil in the financial markets. New and old risks loom high. This workshop invites high quality papers by PhD students in the area of financial intermediation.

Topics of interest include but are not limited to:

- Inflation, rising interest rates and risks to banking sector and the real economy
- Fintech: opportunities and challenges to the banking sector
- Climate change and transition risk: opportunities and challenges to the banking sector
- Non-bank financial intermediation

PhD Mentoring

The aim of the workshop is to allow PhD students to present their research and receive feedback from senior researchers. PhD presentations will be discussed by senior mentors. PhD students in the last stages of their PhD studies (e.g., going in the market in the Autumn of 2023) are particularly encouraged to apply. Accommodation expenses of presenting PhD students will be covered.

The deadline for submission is **May 15, 2023**. PhD papers should be submitted to: bankingcentre@city.ac.uk. There is no paper submission fee. We aim to notify the authors of accepted papers by June 15, 2023. Presenting authors will be invited to the conference dinner.
