



## Respond, recover, reset: the voluntary sector and COVID-19

### Get connected and involved in our research

We are working with NCVO and Sheffield Hallam University to explore how the pandemic is shaping the sector. In particular, we are interested in how the pandemic is impacting voluntary organisations' working practices and operations, their responses, learning, and resilience. Below are the ways that you can get connected and involved in our research.

**Barometer survey:** It is quick, easy and only takes a few minutes to complete. Each round the survey has a set of general questions, with some focussing on a specific theme relevant to the sector. As a small thank you to everyone who takes part, each month after the survey closes there is a chance for participants to win £200, and a £2000 prize draw at the end of the project. **Panel Survey:** We are also conducting a panel survey. The survey will only take about 20 minutes, it will be delivered via telephone, four times across 2021 and will ask you about how your organisation is responding to Covid-19.
